We have secured more Emergency Support Instrument (ESI) funds to purchase additional vials of Veklury in order to bridge the time between the current contract, purchasing Veklury with ESI funding to donate it to countries, and the joint procurement. These vials should be shipped next week (provisionally [redacted] 5.1.2b vials for the Netherlands).

The steering committee for the joint procurement of Veklury is meeting today (29 Sept 20) and we seek the agreement of the members to the draft award decision.

We will then proceed rapidly with the signature of the joint procurement framework contract so that participating countries would be able to make direct contracts shortly after. As the supply of Veklury is likely to exceed the demand in the first three months of the framework contract (Oct-Dec 2020), we will continue to use the allocation key, developed with ECDC, we are currently applying as well.

Please let me express my appreciation for the wonderful cooperation we are having during this Covid-crisis.

Over the weekend we have been in contact on the expected shortages of Veklury, Remdisivir in The Netherlands.

As I understand we see these shortages in more countries.

We are very happy with the recent extra doses that could be assigned to The Netherlands. However, these will only help us out for a short period of time. The real relieve should come from our joint procurement process.

In that respect we would appreciate the opportunity for our [REDACTED] to have a short telephone call with [REDACTED].

Our concern is two-fold. Firstly we believe the number of to be procured doses should - if possible - be extended.

Secondly, the delivery of these doses is still unclear to us. If the period between today and the delivery of these medicines is too long, we risk a period in which we will be out of stock.

Our [REDACTED] has been in contact with your offices to see if such a call is possible on short notice.

So far these attempts have not been successful.

Please let me know what I can do to facilitate this process.
