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Dear HODs and HSRI-PAC members,

Below you will find information on various Covid-19 related research matters/opportunities. I assume you already received some of this information, but to be sure that you don't miss anything, I am collecting the various items in a single mail (and its attachments).

- 1) The Management Team obtained various requests from HSRI researchers for funding of Covid-19 related research. Since we want to support such initiatives, we have decided to provide funding for Covid-19 related research up to a maximum of 10K per project (smaller amounts are also very much okay of course). HSRI researchers can apply by sending me a short proposal with a budget and information on possible follow up grants.
- 2) ZonMw published a program document describing the set-up of the COVID-19 research program (call budget €27 million), and more specifically, the thematic scope, available budgets, and procedures of the forthcoming so-called 'Second Wave' calls. I am attaching the relevant information.
- 3) TU Delft has started the platform www.resilientsociety.nl of which Tilburg University has become a member. This may be of interest for TSB researchers. Note that the link in the attached email is not correct (has two l's).
- 4) TiU wants to stimulate "Knowledge sharing, development and application in relation to COVID-19". One of the things you can do is register your COVID-19 related research/expertise. More information can be found in the attached document.

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
